3. REITHAR MANBUT	The "Moses of her people" who led dozens to freedom on the Underground Railroad.	
4. VAA NURDEVAY	An Oscar-nominated filmmaker and director of "Selma," known for chronicling the Black experience.	
5. DIA B LEWLS	A fearless investigative journalist who led a groundbreaking anti-lynching crusade in the 1890s.	
6. SLIPLIH LEYWTEHA	A literary pioneer who, in 1773, became the first African American to publish a book of poetry.
